Poetry submissions must be in triplicate, one poem per page with the poets name and address on each page; a self-addressed, stamped envelope should accompany each submission.

Short stories are selected only through the annual Brookie and D. K. Brown Memorial Fiction Contest (submission deadline: 1 June 1994). All fiction submissions will be considered as contest entries.

the editor. Letters addressed to specific authors will be
forwarded, unopened, to them.
