Poetry submissions should have one poem per page, with the poet's name and address on each page; a selfaddressed, stamped envelope should accompany each submission. Short poems-haiku, limericks, couplets, and oneliners—are very welcome. Short stories are selected only through the annual Brookie and D. K. Brown Memorial Fiction Contest (submission deadline: 30 June 2002; \$5 fee per story).

Letters for publication should be identified. SUNSTONE does not acknowledge receipt of letters to the editor. Letters addressed to specific authors will be forwarded, unopened, to them.
